

HAND SIZING NOTICE

Correct glove sizing is one of the single most important things that can be done to extend cut resistant glove life.

- Gloves should be snug but not tight.
- Fingers should go all the way to the end of the glove fingers, if glove fingers are slightly short that is OK.
 Gloves will stretch out in a very short time.
- Try using one size smaller than you would normally wear.
- Wear a disposable over-glove to prevent cross contamination and aid in keeping the gloves cleaner for a longer period of time.

Fingertips are most often cut due to the gloves being too large. If the fingertip of the glove is too long, the tip will continually be hit by the knife blade during the prep operation. Because the fingers do not go all the way to the end, the employee does not know the glove finger is being constantly hit. If you should experience prematurely cut fingertips, please check to assure the proper glove size is being worn.

These gloves can be machine washed. They are high or low temperature dishwasher safe. They can be hand washed in sink and are bleach and sanitizer safe. The gloves can be air dried by hanging. Do not place freshly cleaned gloves in a drawer or lay flat on counters. We recommend the use of glove stations to aid in employee compliance, inventory control of the gloves in use and to aid in the drying process.

 Gloves should be sanitized as part of a regular cleaning program.
